## 1. The PRIMARY FOCUS of Prayer      Mt 6:7-13

### *THE LORD'S PRAYER*

<sup>7</sup> "And when you are praying, do not use meaningless repetition as the Gentiles do, for they suppose that they will be heard for their many words. <sup>8</sup> So do not be like them; for your Father knows what you need before you ask Him. <sup>9</sup> Pray, then, in this way:

**'Our Father who is in heaven, hallowed be Your Name.**

<sup>10</sup> **Your Kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven.** <sup>11</sup> Give us this day our daily bread. <sup>12</sup> And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. <sup>13</sup> And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil. [For Yours is the Kingdom & the power & the glory forever. Amen.]"

## 1. The PRIMARY FOCUS of Prayer Mt 6:7-13

**PRAYER** is the medium of our most intimate connection to God, a channel for:

- experiencing His heart & Spirit at work in us;
- expressing our hearts & beings to Him.

Inasmuch as **PRAISE** reflects the most real & ideal response to the reality of who God is, **PRAISE** provides both:

- an absolutely fundamental basis for our **PRAYER** *and*
- the ultimate aim & goal of our **PRAYER** (*cf Re 4:8-11*).

## 2. Praise POWER Through Prayer    Ac 16:23-34

### *PAUL & SILAS IN THE PHILIPPIAN JAIL*

<sup>23</sup> When they had struck them with many blows, they threw them into prison, commanding the jailer to guard them securely;

<sup>24</sup> & he...threw them into the inner prison & fastened their feet in the stocks. <sup>25</sup>

But about midnight Paul & Silas were praying & singing hymns of praise to God, & the prisoners were listening to them; <sup>26</sup> & suddenly there came a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison house were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened.

<sup>27</sup> When the jailer awoke & saw the prison doors opened, he drew his sword & was about to kill himself, supposing that

the prisoners had escaped. <sup>28</sup> But Paul cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here!" <sup>29</sup> And he called for lights & rushed in, & trembling with fear he fell down before Paul & Silas, <sup>30</sup> & after he brought them out, he said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" <sup>31</sup> They said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, & you will be saved...& your household, [too]." <sup>32</sup> And **they spoke the word of the Lord to him together with all who were in his house.** <sup>33</sup> And he took them that [very] hour of the night & washed their wounds, **and immediately he [& all his household were] baptized.** <sup>34</sup> And he brought them into his house & set food before them, **& rejoiced greatly, having believed in God** with his whole household.

## 2. Praise POWER Through Prayer    Ac 16:23-34

**PRAYER** that is **focused on PRAISE** is truly focused on God—His will, righteousness, & love—in other words, His Kingdom of Holy **POWER** which enfranchises us to:

- withstand hardship & persecution courageously;
- love our enemies;
- bear powerful & even miraculous witness to the Gospel.

Ample examples exist in Scripture & the history of the Church of such **PRAISE PRAYERS** **producing miraculous works of God's POWER** that can bring others to **FAITH**.

### 3. Praise PEACE Through Prayer

Ph 4:4-9

#### *PAUL'S PRAYER MODEL*

- <sup>4</sup> Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! <sup>5</sup> Let your gentle [spirit] be known to all people. The Lord is near.
- <sup>6</sup> Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer & supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. <sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts &...minds in Christ Jesus.
- <sup>8</sup> Finally, brethren, whatever is true...honorable...right...pure [&] lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence &...anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things. <sup>9</sup> The things you have learned & received & heard & seen in me, practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

### 3. Praise PEACE Through Prayer

Ph 4:4-9

Even (& perhaps *especially*) when we're in the most trying or fearful circumstances, **letting PRAISE lead and focus our PRAYER** positions us to experience:

- reassurance of God's Presence & care *[1 Pe 5:7];*
- reminders of God's capacity & generosity *[Ja 1:2-5];*
- infusion of His encouraging peace *[Mt 11:28; Jn 14:27].*
